Hawaii Family Forum is a non-partisan, 501(c)(3) organization and does not endorse or oppose any candidate for elected office, whether or not they responded to this survey. We offer this guide to educate the community in Hawaii about the views of the candidates for the office of which they are running.

We understand that many candidates did not respond to the survey, so all links on the electronic PDF version are interactive. The online version will enable you to enlarge the text. Click the candidate's name and you will be directed to either the candidate's website, or their email address, if they didn't provide a website address to the State. We encourage you to reach out to the candidates directly, or visit their campaign websites, to find out more information, especially if they did not respond to the survey. Please be courteous when making contact with any candidate for public office.

KEEP YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION CURRENT

Ballots are mailed to the mailing address associated with your voter registration. If you move to a new residence, change your mailing address or name, you must update your voter registration. You may check online or contact your County Elections Division to confirm that your registration record is current.

RECEIVING YOUR BALLOT

You will receive a GENERAL election mail ballot packet no later than **July 29, 2024**. Your packet consists of a ballot, ballot secrecy sleeve, and a prepaid postage return ballot envelope.

Voters with special needs may request for an electronic ballot through the Voter Registration Application or by contacting their County Elections Division.

RETURNING YOUR BALLOT

You may return your completed ballot by mail or in person at a designated place of deposit within your county. Please keep in mind that ballots must be received by your County Elections Division by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

TRACKING YOUR BALLOT

You may check on the status of your ballot, whether it has been mailed and/or received, by contacting your County Elections Division. Track your ballot at <https://hawaii.ballottrax.net/voter/>

PROCESSING YOUR BALLOT

Upon receipt of your return envelope, your County Elections Division validates the signature to confirm your identity. After your signature is validated, your ballot will be forwarded to state election officials to be counted.

VOTING AT A VOTER SERVICE CENTER

The County Elections Divisions establish voter service centers that will be open 10 days prior and on Election Day. Services include accessible in person voting and same day registration.



Red Hill tanks are sitting 100 feet above a water aquifer that supplies 77% of drinking water to Oahu residents. The level of contamination on groundwater is not yet fully determined. There are also no plans to remove these tanks after they are cleaned, which is totally unacceptable. Maunakea's water is contaminated. 670 gallons of sewage was just dumped into Hilo Bay. Coconut Island is completely contaminated. The EPA is still testing water quality in Lahaina. The redirection of waterways for commercial purposes is destroying the entire ecosystem of all islands and killing the 'Ohi'a Trees. Everything that is happening with Hawai'i's water is a shocking violation of the Clean Water Act. This is a critical problem that must be corrected immediately.






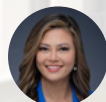
